

Dr. Arthur Weisman is a senior Otolaryngology (ENT) consultant and university assistant lecturer based in Bucharest, Romania. He completed his medical studies at the "Carol Davila" University of Medicine and Pharmacy in Bucharest.

After graduating (2001), Dr. Weisman became an ENT resident at the "Prof. Dr. Hociotă" Institute of Phono-Audiology and Functional ENT Surgery in Bucharest, while also working as a university teaching assistant. Dr. Weisman obtained his ENT specialist degree in 2007, with additional competencies in ENT endoscopic surgery, ENT LASER, and audiology. He became a senior ENT consultant in 2013.

In 2007, Dr. Weisman completed his Ph.D in Medical Sciences with a thesis titled "Surgical Approach in Frontal Sinus Pathology."

Currently, he is a university assistant lecturer at the "Carol Davila" University of Medicine and Pharmacy and has clinical integration at the "Prof. Dr. Hociotă" Institute of Phono-Audiology and Functional ENT Surgery in Bucharest serving as a training base for students and ENT resident doctors.

He also conducts private medical practice at the Optim Sano Medical Center in Bucharest, offering consultations for a wide range of ENT pathologies.

From 2021 to 2024, he held the position of Head of the Audio-Vestibular Functional Explorations Laboratory at the "Prof. Dr. Hociotă" Institute of Phono-Audiology and Functional ENT Surgery.

Dr. Weisman is a member of several professional organizations, including the Bucharest College of Physicians and the Romanian Society of Otorhinolaryngology and Cervicofacial Surgery.

He has participated in numerous national and international postgraduate courses, covering various aspects of ENT practice, including otology, endoscopic surgery, and vestibular disorders.

Throughout his career, Dr. Weisman has published multiple articles, presented at congresses, and contributed to book chapters in the field of otorhinolaryngology.

His areas of medical practice include otology, rhinology, pharyngology, laryngology, and auditory and vestibular functional explorations. He has a special interest in conservative non-surgical, minimally invasive treatment of ENT pathology, focusing on improving patients' quality of life.

Dr. Weisman has been actively involved in academic activities, teaching courses on otology, ENT emergencies, and esophageal pathology to medical students and postgraduate trainees. He has also served as a scientific advisor for medical students' thesis projects and has been invited as a speaker at various workshops and conferences.

Dr. Weisman has participated in numerous national and international conferences and congresses, including the American Academy of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery Foundation Annual Meeting & OTO Expo in Washington, D.C., USA and the Salzburg Weill Cornell Seminar in Otolaryngology, Austria, where he received a certificate of academic excellence.

In recent years, Dr. Weisman has shown a particular interest in vestibular disorders and vertigo. He has completed several courses and webinars on this topic, including "Diagnosing Peripheral Vestibular Disorders" (Interacoustics Academy, 2022) and "Vertigo in Current Medical Practice" (2022). He has also participated in the Viatrix Vertigo International Academy events in 2023 and 2024, focusing on persisting dizziness, cerebellar and functional disorders, peripheral and central vestibular syndromes.

Dr. Weisman's expertise in this field is further demonstrated by his recent publications and presentations. In 2021, he co-authored a case report on "Sudden Sensorineural Hearing Loss Associated with the presence of a Vascular Loop in the Internal Auditory Canal" and presented on the topic of "Audiologist - ENT Surgeon - Imaging Specialist Team in the Diagnosis of Vestibular Schwannoma" at the 6th National Conference organized by the Romanian ENT Imaging Society. In 2023, he co-authored a paper on the "Diagnostic Value of Different Types of Tinnitus" published in the International Tinnitus Journal.

As the Head of the Audio-Vestibular Functional Explorations Laboratory at the "Prof. Dr. Hociotă" Institute of Phono-Audiology and Functional ENT Surgery from 2021 to 2024, Dr. Weisman has gained extensive experience in managing patients with vestibular disorders. His clinical practice includes performing and interpreting various balance tests, otolith repositioning procedures, and providing comprehensive care for patients with vertigo and dizziness.

As President of the Ethics Council at the "Prof. Dr. Hociotă" Institute of Phono-Audiology and Functional ENT Surgery, Dr. Weisman has served two consecutive terms from 2018 to 2024. This role demonstrates his commitment to maintaining high ethical standards in medical practice within the institution. As the head of this important council, he has been involved in overseeing ethical considerations related to patient care and professional conduct among staff. This position highlights Dr. Weisman's leadership qualities and the trust placed in him by his colleagues to guide the ethical direction of the institute.
